

The Minot Area Chamber Economic Development Corporation [MACEDC] was selected as the Air Force Global Strike Command winner of the 2022 Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher Distinguished Civilian Humanitarian Award on Mar. 18, 2022.

Established in 1996 as a tribute to the contributions of Zachary and Elizabeth Fisher, the award honors private sector entities for their dedication to the wellbeing of service members and their families. Nominees display exceptional service and humanitarian concern for each branch of the military and are selected based on their generosity, patriotism and other merits.

For decades, the Minot Area Chamber EDC has supported Minot Air Force Base through advocacy and building a strong relationship between Airmen and civilians. They have secured millions of dollars for area youth education, flood prevention funds and thousands of dollars for Airmen morale programs. Through Airman Against Drunk Driving, Adopt an Airman, and other collaborative programs, the EDC focuses on promoting safety and wellness for TEAM MINOT. They also encourage civic leader engagement in several military events and have worked with base leadership, Key Spouses, First Sergeants, and the community to increase public awareness and garner support for Minot AFB and its mission.

The Chamber EDC was nominated by the 5th Bomb Wing with a recommendation from Maj. Gen. Andrew Gebara, 8th Air Force commander. After winning the award for AFGSC, the Chamber EDC will now compete for the award at the Air Force level.



CITY OF MINOT SWITCHING TO NEW UTILITY BILLING SYSTEM ON APRIL 18


The City of Minot's new utility billing system will go live on April 18.

Current City utility customers who use electronic bank transfer or recurring credit card payments will need to create a new account when the new system begins operating, according to Finance Director Dave Lakefield. Accounts can only be created once the new system is in use.

"The new system includes features that make viewing bills and paying online much more convenient," Lakefield said. "This will be a major improvement for our customers, but they will need to create a new account to access the system. If you aren't currently using electronic methods to pay your City utility bill, April 18 is the start of an excellent opportunity to make the switch to online billing."

Under the new system, customers will have options to perform a variety of functions, including ways to view a bill online, link a bank account for auto pay, link a credit card for recurring payments, and make one-time credit card payments. Customers will still have options to pay bills by mail and by phone.

The City will provide updates and information to utility customers regarding the new system, Lakefield said. Information will be distributed through the City of Minot's website at minotnd.org, on City social media pages, in the twice-monthly electronic City newsletter, and in letters included with monthly utility bills. Emily Wilhelmina Dufke Lunde was born in northern Minnesota and, as she says, "with a handle like that you had to have a sense of humor." Laurel Reuter, Director of the Museum says of this North Dakota folk artist: "Were the people of North Dakota to name their living treasures, Emily Lunde would certainly be among them. She is one of the state's eminent folk artists and unofficial cultural historians." As both artist and author, Mrs. Lunde has recorded the life of Scandinavian immigrants settling the prairies and small towns of the Red River Valley during the early 20th century.

Mrs. Lunde did not begin to paint until the 1950s and always painted from memory. Her oils are widely collected. Dr. Robert Bishop, the late Director of the Museum of American Folk Art in New York City, personally gave over forty of

her paintings to the Art in Embassies program for loan around the world.

I amaze myself when I think about what I was doing at the time. I was between five and ten years old when I perceived these things that went into my paintings. I was analyzing the adults. I guess you can't fool children as much as you want to.



Rural Arts Initiative

The North Dakota Museum of Art is the State's official art museum. As it is located in Grand Forks, it can be difficult for schools to plan day trips to the Museum. Due to the great distances some schools face, the Museum started touring exhibitions to towns throughout North Dakota through its Rural Arts Initiative program, which started in 2003. Since then, exhibitions have been installed in all corners of North Dakota, including smaller towns such as Crosby, Pekin, and Bowman, and larger cities such as Jamestown, Fargo, and Bismarck. The Museum's Education Department delivers, installs, and de-installs exhibitions of original artwork free-ofcharge to North Dakota communities.

A Primary goal of the Museum's Rural Arts Initiative program is to provide North Dakota schools with quality arts education opportunities. The Museum works with community members to bring schools within a 50 to 60-mile radius of the exhibition site to participate in this unique arts education program. To assist schools with out-of-pocket expenses, the Museum offers travel reimbursements for North Dakota schools wishing to participate. Lesson plans and activities are also available for free download on the Museum's website.

TRINITY HEALTH FOUNDATION FUNDS GE GIRAFFE OMNIBEDS FOR NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT (NICU)

Trinity Health Foundation recently funded the purchase of two GE Giraffe Omnibeds for the NICU totaling close to \$83,000.

Omnibeds provide extremely low birth weight babies the opportunity to receive care in one bed minimizing movements which have the potential to create major complications such as brain bleeds that can lead to lifelong morbidity. The beds provide easy care access for a number of procedures and also serve as a warmer, when needed. Humidity can be added into the bed when it becomes an incubator providing a critical treatment for NICU babies. Omnibeds also include a built-in scale making weighing procedures much safer for the baby, creating less stress and handling.

This equipment enhances the quality of care Trinity Health provides to NICU patients. Though not mandated, the Omnibeds help ensure better outcomes for the extremely low birthweight babies.

This Omnibeds will be used now and then moved into the new hospital facility, once complete. The department hopes to equip the new NICU with a total of 6 Omnibeds. COMMUNITY ACTION OPPORTUNITIES OF MINOT RECEIVES GRANT TO SUPPORT COUNSELING PROGRAMS


North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) has been awarded a \$72,840 housing counseling grant by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The agency will split the grant between two affiliate organizations – Community Action Opportunities of Minot and Southeastern North Dakota Community Action Agency of Fargo.

"The counseling grant supports services primarily for renters and households experiencing homelessness or who are at risk of homelessness," said David Flohr, NDHFA executive director. "Assistance provided includes help finding affordable rental housing, pre-rental counseling, delinquency assistance and help with credit issues."

Individuals and families in need of assistance are encouraged to reach out to one of the HUD-certified housing counseling agencies to understand their options. No fees are charged for the services. NDHFA acts as an intermediary for the counseling dollars, applying to HUD on behalf of the local organizations. The agency's role is primarily to help improve the quality of the counseling services and enhance coordination among the providers.

A self-supporting state agency, NDHFA is dedicated to making housing affordable for all North Dakotans. The North Dakota Industrial Commission, consisting of Governor Doug Burgum as chairman, Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring and Attorney General Drew H. Wrigley, oversees NDHFA. NURSING RESIDENCY PROGRAM TO HONOR GRADUATES

On April 13, Trinity Health will honor 11 graduates of the Nursing Residency Program. The celebration marks the completion of the eighth cohort and will take place at Trinity Health Riverside Auditorium, 10 a.m.- noon.

The Nurse Residency Program was adapted by Trinity Health in 2017 to mitigate nurse turnover and facilitate new graduate nurse transition to real-world practice. It was developed by the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) and utilizes science-based curriculum that supports Novice-to-Expert and adult learning principles in a health care setting.

"Studies show that the national average for nurse turnover the first year is 20-27 percent. Data shows that most new nurses quit within their first six months," said Kelly Hackett, BSN, RN, Nurse Residency/student coordinator. "The hospital setting is becoming more complex, with increased use of technology and higher patient acuity, which can be overwhelming for a new nurse, and lead to high turnover rates."

Trinity Health offers three cohorts per year that meet once a month for 12 months. The residency is mandatory for all new nurses with less than six months experience. Classes include subject matter expert lectures, simulations and discussions; clinical reflections to share best practices; and an evidence-based practice project where groups create a solution to enhance or improve an aspect of their work. Often, the solution is incorporated into nursing practice.

Hackett said the evidence-based project is a win-win for both residents and Trinity Health. "The practice project requires the group to develop critical thinking skills, communicate across departments and have a solution-based mentality for an opportunity to improve a process. When they see their project implemented, residents gain insight into the change process and become more invested in the organization because they understand their voices matter, which impacts retention."

Since inception, 143 nurses have completed Trinity Health's Nursing Residency Program. The ninth cohort is currently in progress and consists of 22 residents who will graduate June 28, 2022.
